Triple negative breast cancer is a very aggressive type for which we desperately need newer, more targeted treatment. At the Breakthrough Research Unit, King's College London we are tackling this unmet need in breast cancer research.

Breakthrough Breast Cancer is committed to establishing The Sarah Greene Clinical Fellowship in Spring 2010. This Fellowship will give one talented medical doctor the chance to make a massive contribution towards our vision. Our Clinical Fellow will blend clinical practice at Guy's Hospital with scientific research at the Breakthrough Unit next door, where they will have access to world-class facilities.

We would not have been able to take this ground-breaking step without the commitment of Sarah's family and friends and we are proud that you believe in this project's potential as much as we do. It is admirable that you have promised to raise enough money by cycling through Ireland to fund the Fellowship, which includes salary and specialised laboratory equipment. Raising £300-£400,000 is a big target but together we can make it!

In September 2010, more than 100 cyclists will pedal their way across Ireland in Sarah's memory, to help achieve this extraordinary fundraising challenge.
